Tina Verst was a radiant and dynamic 7th and 8th grade teacher at St. Philip School from the year 2000 to 2012. She will always be remembered for her perseverance, love for giving, and dedication to her classroom. Tina believed strongly in all her students. She strove to instill a level of student confidence that transitioned into excellent achievement. In addition to her work as a teacher, she served the Girl Scouts and Boy Scouts, helped found the St. Philip Math Counts and Academic Team programs, and contributed to the development of the Chess & Archery Clubs. Tina was also proud to help with the coordination of an annual St. Philip Walk for Life in support of the New Hope Center. In 2010 she was honored with the Toyota Collaborative Business in Education Award. To commemorate the memory of our lost veterans, she secured a grant for the repair of the long dormant belfry light in the church bell tower. Perhaps one of her fondest activities was a class project to record and document WWII stories of a local veteran. The collection can be found in the St. Philip library. Tina was able to give much of herself to a community she grew to love.
